

English: The Apple and the Arrow

Travel brochures

- Genres: Narrative, adventures, recounts, poetry, letters, creating suspense
- Grammar: Noun phrases expanded by the addition of modifying adjectives, nouns and preposition phrases; identifying determiners; standard English forms of verb inflections, word classes
- Spelling: Words with the ay sound spelt eigh, ei ,ey / words ending in –ous / words with the s sound spelt sc
- Punctuation: Commas, bullet points, apostrophe for omission and possession
- Composition: Appropriate choice of noun or pronoun to avoid repetition; using the present perfect form of verbs in contrast to the past tense; using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause

Maths

Number: Multiplication and Division

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12 x 12

Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally, including: multiplying by 0 and 1; dividing by 1; multiplying together three numbers

Recognise and use factor pairs and commutativity in mental calculations

Multiply two digit and three digit numbers by a one digit number using formal written layout

Solve problems involving multiplying and adding, including using the distributive law to multiply two digit numbers by one digit, integer scaling and harder correspondence problems

- Alps v Lake District v The Caribbean
- Comparing different locations
- Physical Geography– climate, landscape
- Human Geography- population, land use, tourism, homes
- Watercolour paintings of landscapes
